Force Protection Conditions (FPCON) System**

**PREFACE:** FPCONs describe the progressive level of countermeasures in anticipation of or response to a terrorist threat to US military resources and personnel. These FPCONs have been derived from DoDI 2000.16 and adapted to best meet the needs of the Air Force. Air Force commanders are responsible for their implementation. As well as the measures printed in the attachment, the following applies:

Ensure you have implemented an effective antiterrorism plan and this plan is widely known and practiced in order to use “every airman as a sensor”.

Analyze the threat and plan courses of action to defeat those threats: detailed planning against plausible enemy courses of action will often point to vulnerabilities which can be mitigated through adjustments to Tactics, Techniques, and Procedures (TTP) and further mitigated through innovation and programming.

Development and implementation of effective friendly Course of Action (COA) to counter known threats offers a reasonable deterrent effect and the opportunity for long-term success against terrorist attack: consider force on force or intruder play to test these COAs.

Ensure personnel assigned tasks directed by FPCON measures are properly trained and available to carry out the task.

Based on your threat, employ sufficient patrols to deter enemy action, disrupt terrorist planning, and respond to incidents or attacks against the installation: these patrols should focus protection on critical operational assets, mission support infrastructure and mass gathering places.

Consider placing barriers around identified critical assets, restricted areas, high occupancy facilities, flight line entry points, and high value resource areas to create standoff.

Review and be familiar with mutual aid and host tenant support agreements; keep law enforcement agencies (federal, state and local) apprised of the current situation and threat to determine the level of incident support the installation provides or receives.

Ensure the installation Disaster Response Force and its sub elements are trained and available for response.

The JBLE Threat Working Group (TWG) will evaluate any threat information and recommend the appropriate FPCON. The Wing Commander or Vice Commander is the Force Protection Condition declaration authority for JBLE.

Compliance with this checklist is mandatory. Deviations must be approved by the WG/CC or the WG/CV. This checklist applies to all JBLE units including tenant units.

FP Condition	Details
<u>Normal</u>	<p><b>(CUI) General.</b> FPCON NORMAL applies at all times as a general threat of terrorist attacks, hostile acts, or other security threats always exists in the world.</p> <p><b>(CUI) Purpose.</b> The FPCON NORMAL mandatory measures prescribed in Paragraph 3.6. are always in effect, regardless of the FPCON level a commander declares. Commanders use FPCON NORMAL to focus their efforts on educating their personnel on the terrorist and hostile adversary threats, deterring and detecting these threats, and reporting indications of these and other suspicious activities, to maintain a level of protection the Secretary of Defense requires for all DoD elements and personnel against terrorist attacks and hostile acts.</p> <p><b>(CUI) Intent.</b> During FPCON NORMAL, commanders ensure their personnel are knowledgeable on terrorist and hostile actor threats; understand the individual actions they can take to protect themselves and others from terrorist attack; know procedures for reporting suspicious activities and incidents; deter and detect general, non-specific threats of terrorist attacks and hostile acts; and prepare to implement additional FPCON measures designed to delay, deny, and defend against these threats.</p>
<u>Alpha</u>	<p><b>(CUI) General.</b> FPCON ALPHA applies to a non-specific threat of a terrorist attack or hostile act directed against DoD elements and personnel.</p> <p><b>(CUI) Purpose.</b> Commanders declare FPCON ALPHA when a terrorist attack or hostile act is possible, but no specific information exists indicating a direct or indirect threat to DoD elements and personnel.</p> <p><b>(CUI) Intent.</b> During FPCON ALPHA, commanders:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. (CUI) Implement enhanced capabilities to deter and detect general, non-specific threats of terrorist attacks, hostile acts, and other security threats targeting DoD elements and personnel.</li> <li>b. (CUI) Prepare to implement additional measures designed to delay, deny, and defend against these threats should the likelihood or expected consequences of these threats increase.</li> </ul> <p><b>(CUI) Mission Impact.</b> Commanders must be able to sustain applicable FPCON ALPHA measures indefinitely.</p>
<u>Bravo</u>	<p><b>(CUI) General.</b> FPCON BRAVO applies when an increased or more predictable threat of a terrorist attack or hostile act exists and is directed against DoD elements and personnel.</p> <p><b>(CUI) Purpose.</b> Commanders declare FPCON BRAVO when information indicates that a direct or indirect threat of a terrorist attack or hostile act targeting DoD elements and personnel is likely but the specific timing, nature, and targets of these threats cannot be identified.</p> <p><b>(CUI) Intent.</b> During FPCON BRAVO, commanders:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. (CUI) Implement mandatory and supplemental FPCON measures to enhance the deterrence and detection of terrorist attacks, hostile acts, and security threats.</li> <li>b. (CUI) Prepare to implement supplemental FPCON measures designed to delay, deny, or defend against these threats should the probability or expected consequences of these threats increase.</li> </ul> <p><b>(CUI) Mission Impact.</b> Commanders must be able to sustain all applicable FPCON BRAVO measures indefinitely and must understand FPCON BRAVO will likely affect missions and base support operations during prolonged implementation.</p>
<u>Charlie</u>	<p><b>(CUI) General.</b> FPCON CHARLIE applies when a terrorist or hostile act incident occurs within the commander's area of interest (AOI), or intelligence is received indicating a hostile act or some form of terrorist action or targeting against DoD elements, personnel, or facilities is likely.</p> <p><b>(CUI) Purpose.</b> Commanders declare FPCON CHARLIE when they receive information that indicates direct or indirect terrorist attacks or hostile acts directed against DoD elements and personnel are occurring or are likely to occur within the commander's AOI, requiring additional FPCON measures.</p> <p><b>(CUI) Intent.</b> During FPCON CHARLIE, commanders:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. (CUI) Implement mandatory and supplemental FPCON measures designed to apply delay and deny effects against terrorist attacks and hostile acts.</li> <li>b. (CUI) Implement additional plans and procedures to defend against, respond to, and recover from, these increased threats, should they occur.</li> </ul> <p><b>(CUI) Mission Impact.</b> FPCON CHARLIE measures will very likely affect missions and base support. Commanders must ensure that they can sustain applicable FPCON CHARLIE measures throughout the entirety of the threat.</p>
<u>Delta</u>	<p><b>(CUI) General.</b> FPCON DELTA applies when a terrorist attack or hostile act has occurred or is anticipated against specific installations or operating areas.</p> <p><b>(CUI) Purpose.</b> Commanders declare FPCON DELTA to focus the necessary installation or organizational capabilities on mitigating and eliminating the threat.</p> <p><b>(CUI) Intent.</b> During FPCON DELTA, commanders focus on implementing capabilities in response to and containment of a terrorist attack or hostile act, and to support recovery efforts in emergency management plans.</p> <p><b>(CUI) Mission Impact.</b> FPCON DELTA should be maintained on a limited basis and only be declared so long as the necessary response capabilities are required. Commanders declaring FPCON DELTA must be prepared to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. (CUI) Implement applicable measures to respond to, defeat, and recover from the attack. Such measures must be implemented in accordance with the rules for the carrying of firearms (arming) and the use of force (to include less than lethal and deadly force) by personnel engaged in security, law enforcement, or counterintelligence activities (e.g. protection of personnel, property and installations) prescribed in DoDD 5210.56 and rules of engagement prescribed in CJCS Instruction 3121.01B.</li> <li>b. (CUI) Stop all non-essential support functions, operations, and movement unless they are in direct support of the attack response or continuity of operations.</li> <li>c. (CUI) Implement measures to deter, detect, delay, deny, and defend against follow-on attacks.</li> </ul>
