

# JBLE – Eustis Operations



#### **Historic Operations at Fort Eustis / JBLE-Eustis**

- 8,200-acre Fort Eustis on peninsula formed by Warwick and James Rivers in Newport News, Virginia (VA)
- Established during World War I, operations included:
  - Training center for Coast Artillery Corps
  - Balloonist school
- Post-World War I operations included:
  - Federal correction camp
  - Works Progress Administration facility
  - National Youth Administration facility
  - Bombing range for Langley Air Force Base
  - Anti-aircraft training facility
  - Prisoner-of-war camp
  - Transportation training center

# JBLE – Eustis Operations



- JBLE-Eustis is the current home to the Army Transportation Center; training in all modes of transportation, aviation maintenance, logistics and deployment doctrine
- Identified ERP sites included landfills, Underground Storage Tanks (USTs), pesticide storage areas, range/impact areas, and surface impoundments

### JBLE – Eustis ERP Overview



#### What has led to the development of the JBLE – Eustis ERP?

- The potential risk to human health and the environment was significant enough for U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) to place Fort Eustis on the National Priorities List (NPL) in December 1994 due to:
  - Analysis of samples indicated presence of polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs), pesticides, polyaromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs), and lead in surface water and sediment
  - Migration of contaminants to creeks and estuaries and the upper water table at some sites; potential for impact to the James River

### JBLE – Eustis ERP Overview



- On October 1, 2010, Joint Base Langley-Eustis formed and the U.S. Air Force assumed the U.S. Army's obligations under the 2008 Federal Facility Agreement (FFA) to outline how to proceed with cleanup

### JBLE – Eustis IRP Activities



- Landfill 001 in study
  - Previously in LTM; identified additional soil cover needed
  - Pre-design investigation underway
- Landfill 004 in LTM
- Water sites in LTM: CS036 Eustis Lake, SI029 Brown's Lake and CS030 Bailey Creek
  - Currently Land Use Controls restricting sediment disturbance
  - Catch and release fishing at CS036 and SI029
  - Catch and release fishing at CS030 only from footbridge down gradient of site
- Last Five-Year Review determined sites protective of human health and the environment



### JBLE – Eustis IRP Activities



#### SR037 and SR038 Upland and Wetland Skeet Range

- Clean-up activities completed 2020
- Further erosion control/vegetation re-establishment needed
- Boundary survey needed to finalize Remedial Action Completion Report

#### AT006 Former Fire Training Area in study

Draft Final Supplemental Remedial Investigation Report

#### Five-Year Review

- Kickoff Aug 2022
- Community Notification Published 23 Nov 2022
- Draft Five-Year Review to USEPA and Virginia Department of Environmental Quality (VDEQ) Jun 2023

## JBLE – Eustis MMRP Activities



- 17 Areas Identified as potential "ranges"
- 9 Areas No Further Action (NFA): ineligible, no hazard or never built
- 8 Areas Under study
  - 2 Areas Site Inspection Phase:
    - FR008 Towable Target Range
    - FR015 Western Shore Ranges
  - 6 Areas Remedial Investigation (RI) Phase:
    - SR004 Langley Field Gunnery Range / XU002 Bombing Target H – Draft Quality Assurance Project Plan
    - SR012 1000-inch Rifle Range
    - SR013 / SR014 Shotgun Range
    - FR011 Camp Wallace Firing Fan

SR - Small Arms Range FR - Firing Range XU - Unexploded Munitions Area

## JBLE – Eustis PFAS Activities




- Apr 2015 Final Preliminary Assessment
- Jun 2017 Final Site Inspection at 3 areas
  - Former Fire Training Area, Current Fire Training Area & Fire Station #2
  - USEPA's 2016 perfluorooctane sulfonate (PFOS) and perflourooctanoic acid (PFOA) lifetime health advisories for drinking water were exceeded in groundwater at the 3 areas
  - No human health exposures identified; drinking water supplied by Newport News Water Works
- Phase 1 RI contract awarded Jun 2022
  - Phase 1 RI to determine nature/extent in soil and groundwater
  - Draft Report Estimated Completion Date (ECD): Nov 2024
  - Final Report ECD: Jul 2025
- Phase 2 RI Estimated Start Date (ESD)
   2025
  - Conduct human health and ecological risk assessments

### JBLE – Eustis Community Involvement Plan



- Drafting JBLE-Eustis Community Involvement Plan (CIP) ECD 2024
- Previous plan updated 2020
  - JBLE-Eustis does not have a Restoration Advisory Board (RAB)
  - Previous Technical Review Committee inactive since 2012 due to lack of public interest
- Upcoming Community Notification Community Interest Survey being standardized across Air Force – ECD 2023
- Seeking new means of public outreach for JBLE-Eustis
