

SCOPE AND COMMITMENT STATEMENT

Installation Supplement - Eustis

Overview:

Joint Base Langley-Eustis (JBLE) - Eustis adopts the Air Force (AF) Environmental Management System (EMS) Playbook procedure for this element. The following supplemental content describes how JBLE-Eustis intends to implement this procedure.

Scope:

The scope of JBLE-Eustis installation-level EMS includes all the activities, services and products associated with sustaining the operations under the Installation Management responsibilities of the 733d Mission Support Group, including the U.S. Army Training and Doctrine Command Headquarters, 7th Transportation Brigade, 597th Transportation Brigade, 128th Aviation Battalion, and over 15 tenant units with maintenance, security, personnel support, services and housing for a base community hosting more than 22,000 active duty, civilian, and retired personnel.

Purpose:

The Air Force has established an environmental, safety, and occupational health policy, [AF Policy Directive 90-8, Environment, Safety & Occupational Health Management and Risk Management](#). The JBLE Environmental Policy Statement supplements this policy with installation-specific requirements and concerns, in accordance with DoDI 4715.17, *Environmental Management Systems*. The purpose of this procedure is to define the JBLE-Eustis Environmental Policy Statement to protect built and natural infrastructure, protect the environment where 733 MSG and Mission Partners live and work and ensure sustainability of the missions of the 733 MSG and Mission Partners.

Background:

The JBLE Policy Statement is the driver for managing the JBLE-Eustis activities that impact the environment. The scope of the JBLE Environmental Policy Statement states JBLE-Eustis' commitment to maintain compliance, prevent pollution, execute plans for energy, environmental, safety and occupational

health objectives and targets, continually improvement, and communicate environmental commitments to all organizations and local community.

Due to the complexity, size and geographic separation of units on JBLE, each sub-location has separate EMS programs. Additionally, each sub-location has its own dedicated Environmental, Safety, and Occupational Health Council (ESOHC), ESOHC Secretary, EMS Cross-Functional Team (CFT), EMS coordinator and subcommittee or working group.

Both ESOHCs are chaired by the 633 ABW/CV. The 633 ABW/CV has appointed the 733 MSG/CCD as the CFT Chairman and an EMS Coordinator from the 733d Civil Engineer Squadron, Environmental Element.

JBLE- Eustis Environmental Policy Statement:

Our ability as Joint Base Langley-Eustis (JBLE) to conduct our mission requires daily operations in the land, sea and air environments. Protecting each is an integral and mandatory part of accomplishing our mission.

We are committed to sustaining JBLE through a **C.L.E.A.N.** approach:

1. **Comply** - We will comply with all environmental regulations and all other requirements while reducing compliance costs and liabilities.
2. **Limit impact** - We will prevent pollution and minimize waste while cleaning up past sites of environmental concern and making efforts to achieve Chesapeake Bay conservation.
3. **Execute plans** - We will identify and attain energy, environment, safety and occupational health objectives and targets through planning that is Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Realistic, and Timely (SMART).
4. **Achieve improvements** - We will continuously improve our programs and processes through the use of effective management and planning.
5. **Notify** - We will communicate our environmental commitments and performance to all levels of our organization and local community.

It is the responsibility of all military personnel, civilian employees and support contractors to perform their duties in a manner that prevents pollution, protects the environment and conserves natural resources.

We will ensure the continual improvement of our environmental systems and the overall accomplishment of our core mission by following these commitments.

Procedure:

The JBLE Policy Statement (shared by JBLE-Eustis and JBLE-Langley) is updated when a new Commander is assigned to JBLE. The current Policy Statement was signed by Col Beaulieu on 7 Feb 22.

The policy statement covers all requirements in [AFI 32-7001](#), *Environmental Management*.

JBLE's Environmental Policy Statement is shared and communicated internally on the JBLE-Eustis eDASH. JBLE-Eustis also provides this policy statement during Newcomer Orientation training. The policy is posted on the [733 CES](#) and [Environmental Element](#) websites for public viewing and can also be found [here](#) in the eDASH files. The policy statement was distributed to JBLE-Eustis personnel as part of an annual review on 7 Jul 22, as shown in the email found [here](#).

The policy statement is reviewed by the CFT and ESOHC on an annual basis and revised as necessary. Documentation of these reviews are maintained on eDASH.
